Beaugez didn't read or write much in his youth and mainly spent his time focusing on playing guitar and forming rock bands. Later, while a student at Mississippi State University, Beaugez decided to major in English, and his writing career began shortly after. He was hired as a music critic for the student newspaper, The Reflector, and eventually worked his way up

Upon completion of his degree, Beaugez was hired to write for Destinations, a travel magazine. Some of his travel writing has highlighted interesting locations in Mississippi, such as Clark Creek Natural Area in Wilkinson County and the Isle of Caprice, an island off the coast that was submerged in the 1930s.

Today, Beaugez's writing focus for Rolling Stone is Americana music, and he's covered artists such as Jason Isbell and The Avett Brothers. He also cov-

ers artists and musicians in Guitar Player, where he is able to write about multiple genres. Along with Clinton native and videographer J.B. Lawrence, Beaugez has

created a series for Guitar Player called "My Life in Five Riffs," which highlights guitarists and musicians like Nels Cline and Ryan Bing-

While roots rock and Americana

take the forefront of what Beaugez is doing, he's had experience covering other genres, as well, from bluegrass and country to punk and metal.

'To me, it's not as much about the genre as it is the story. You have to find the conflict in a situation to make it a compelling story. That's what I really like about writing - the challenge of finding that twist, the unexpected,' Beaugez said.


Besides music, Beaugez writes about technology for the audio-visual industry.
