Girls soccer continues hot streak with first ever victory over Whitewater

The Edgerton girls soccer team has been on a tear of late, but even considering this they enjoyed what was unequivocally the best week of their season beginning Monday, May 6, with a thunderous 10-1 victory over Clinton. They followed this win by accomplishing something the team has never been able to do until this point: defeating details, which the Tiders managed in a details. In a deluge last Monday at Clinton High School, the Edgerton girls managed to

keep their footing among the mud and rain, putting up a season high point total while only allowing a single goal to their Rock Valley Conference opponent. Considering the final score of the match, it kicked off surprisingly close. Just before the game's sixth minute, Lizzy Gould notched an unassisted goal. At 10:20, Clinton's Liz Kalk was able to even the score at 1-1. From this point, however, it was all Edgerton. Shortly after Clinton drew even, Cammi Gould managed to score back to back goals, at the 12:43 and

19:24 marks respectively, giving the Tiders a lead they would never relinquish. Following Gould's goals, Edgerton's Nadia Kim also notched two straight scores, at the 44:46 and 48:37 marks, and a third to secure the Tider's first hat trick of the season at 68:14. Additional goals from Edgerton players were scored by Lizzy Gould, who tallied another just after the sixty-first minute; Raquel Alvarez at 72:12; and Spencer Stamm at 79:20. And while it's easy to see the score and note Edgerton's explosive

offense in the match, it was their defense who played just as stoutly, as only 2 shots on goal were allowed the entire game. A mere three days after their rout of Clinton, the Edgerton girls soccer team hosted Whitewater in a game to remember, as the team defeated their conference rivals 6-4, locking in their first ever victory against the whippets. From the jump, it appeared the Tiders meant business last Thursday, as Nadia Kim was able to score the game's first goal in a mere 42 seconds. This

was followed by a Cammi Gould score at 17:17 to put Edgerton up 2-0 early. Whitewater would claw back though, scoring three from Lizzy Gould put the Tiders back out in front at 74 minutes, Whitewater's Meilaya Korf then drew the Whippets even just before the game's seventy-seventh minute.

Leave it up to two of the Tider's top scorers to push ahead in the waning minutes of the match, as Nadia Kim put the team ahead with another at 82:03 and Lizzy Gould completed her first hat trick of the season by scoring at 88:01 putting the Tiders up 6-4 which would end up as the game's final score.
