## Tiders track teams turn in strong finishes at Rock Valley Conference meet

The Edgerton boys and girls track season is almost at its end, and it seems the 2019 campaign blew by almost as fast as sophomore Tony Beighley runs the 110 meter hurdles. Last Saturday, May 11, both Edgerton teams competed in the annual Rock Valley Conference meet, with the boys finishing fifth out of 10 teams overall, and the girls finishing ninth.

Per usual, a large number of Tiders performed exceptionally in individual events. For the Edgerton boys, no one had a better day than Tony Beighley, who has shined in hurdle sprints all season, but stepped his game up in a major way for last weekend's conference meet. He was able to take second place in an eye-popping three different events, including

the 110 meter hurdles (16.79 seconds), high jump (5 feet, 10 inches), and long jump (20 feet, 5 inches). Beighly also finished fourth in the 300 meter hurdles, clocking in at 44.04 seconds.

Other top finishers for the Edgerton boys included Ethan Krause, who has excelled in pole vault this year, his first season attempting the event, and was able to take home 2nd place last Saturday with a height of 12 feet. Alongside Beighly's second place finish in the 100 meter hurdles was Nicholas Spang, who took fourth place with a time of 17.42. Lastly, the Tiders 4x100 relay team of Jared Aokoh, Micah Boyd, Jordan Kaufman, and Devin Jorgenson grabbed fourth place with a time of 45.72 seconds.

For the Edgerton girls, freshman Ruby Schieldt turned in a strong performance that belied her age.

Schildt, who was a standout runner for the Edgerton girls cross country team this year, showed that her distance running ability translates just as well to the track. She was able to finish third in the 800 meter run, finishing in 2:27.82, and fourth place in the 400 meter dash, where she clocked in at 1:04.97.

Other Edgerton girls with strong finishes included Olivia Brittan in the triple jump, where she notched second place with a leap of 31 feet and 8 inches, and Jordan Allen in the pole vault, who finished in sixth place after notching a height of 7 feet and 6 inches. As she has all season, Edgerton senior Morgan Demrow anchored the team's throwers, and was able to earn a pair of sixth place finishes in the discus throw, after hurling 90 feet and 9 inches, and the shot put, where she tossed 30 feet and 5 inches.

## Tiders win at Abbey Springs

Nothing spectacular. That is how Edgerton High boys golf coach Terry Dickinson assessed his team's performance in winning the Abbey Springs Invitational on Monday.

The Crimson Tide shot a 321 total to outdistance the rest of the field in the 16-team tournament at

Abbey Springs.

Cambridge finished second with a 333, while Kettle Moraine Lutheran was third at 367.

Edgerton senior Joe Forsting shot a 1-over 73 for medalist honors. Teammate Kyle Wille finished third with a 75.

"That is what I am expecting now for Joe or Kyle to shoot right around par," Dickinson said.

Braden Hurst added an 86

and Clayton Jenny chipped in with an 87.

Bryce Tate carded an 89, but his score was not included in Edgerton's team total.

"I was pleased with the performance," Dickinson said. "The other guys need to step up their game a little bit to shoot in the low 80s for us to get through to state again."

The Tiders finished second in the WIAA Division 2 State Tournament last year."
