VA holding town halls at end of May

"The VA MISSION Act of 2018 empowers Veterans and Enhances care options," said John Rohrer, hospital Director. "We are proactively communicating these changes to our Veterans to ensure they understand these new benefits.'

Weekly road construction update

Two lanes remain open to traffic on I-39/90 (in each direction) during daytime hours and weekends. Access remains open to area businesses in the project area. Please continue to patronize the area businesses!

NOTE: Next week Monday through Friday, nightly single lane closures (8 p.m. -5 a.m.) are planned on I-39/90 northbound and southbound in the following work zones, unless noted otherwise. Minor delays may occur during these lane closures.

I-39/90 southbound expansion (County AB to E. Church Road, north of the US 51 interchange (Stoughton Exit 156), Madison to Edgerton

County MN, Drotning Road, County W and County B underpasses

Anticipated construction completion: Mid-November 2019

All I-39/90 traffic shifted onto the northbound concrete pavement from East Church Road, north of the US 51 interchange, to County AB near Madison.

Two lanes remain open in each direction, separated by a median barrier wall

County MN under I-39/90 is closed until fall 2019 (weatherpermitting). Alternate routes are required; follow the posted detour.

Drotning Road under I-39/90 is closed until fall 2019 (weather-permitting). Alternate local routes are required.

County W under the Interstate is open. County B under I-39/90 is

closed until late May 2019. Alternate local routes are re-

quired. I-39/90 expansion (Kennedy

Road to Rock River bridges), Janesville to Edgerton Townline Road, County M

and Newville Road under-

Anticipated construction completion: Fall 2020

I-39/90 traffic located on their respective sides from Kennedy Road, north of the WIS 26 interchange, to south of the Rock River bridges.

Two lanes remain open in each direction during daytime hours and weekends.

Townline Road under I-39/90 remains open until mid-July 2019.

County M under the Interstate remains open until early July 2019. Newville Road under I-39/90 is open until early July 2019.

I-39/90 expansion at WIS 26/Milton Avenue and US 14/Humes Road interchanges, Janesville

Kennedy Road underpass Anticipated construction completion: Fall 2021

Long-term ramp closure: The WIS 26/Milton Avenue ramp to I-39/90 northbound closed until early August 2019.

Alternate routes required during the four-month closure, such as the US 14 interchange.

All I-39/90 traffic shifted onto the southbound side from Kennedy Road, north of the WIS 26 interchange (Exit 171A), to the US 14 interchange (Exit 171B). Traffic will remain in this configuration until summer 2020.

Two lanes remain open in each direction, separated by a median barrier wall.

Kennedy Road under I-39/90 is closed to through traffic until late July 2019.

Alternate local routes are required. Access is maintained to N. Kennedy Road and N. Brentwood Drive.

The Ice Age Trail under I-39/90, adjacent to Kennedy Road, is closed until October 2020.

I-39/90 southbound expansion (south of US 14/Humes Road interchange to Hart Road bridge over I-39/90), Janesville to Beloit

Mount Zion Avenue, East Milwaukee Street, Ruger Avenue, Palmer Drive, County O/Delavan Drive and Townline Road

Anticipated construction completion: Spring 2020

All I-39/90 traffic shifted onto the northbound concrete pavement from the WIS 11/Avalon Road interchange (Exit 177) to south of the US 14 interchange (Exit 171B).

Two lanes remain open in each direction, separated by a median barrier wall.

Updated: Traffic switch: By Monday morning (May 13), all I-39/90 traffic will have shifted onto the new northbound concrete pavement from Hart Road near Beloit north to the WIS

11/Avalon Road interchange (Exit 177).

Two lanes will remain open in each direction, separated by a median barrier wall.

Updated: Mount Zion Avenue under I-39/90 in Janesville is scheduled to be closed to all traffic for bridge demolition. 6 a.m. Wednesday (May 15)

to 6 p.m. Friday (May 17)

Alternate local routes will be required.

Updated: Nighttime closure of the WIS 11/Racine Street ramp to I-39/90 southbound in Janesville.

Updated: The I-39/90 southbound ramps to and from County S/Shopiere Road (Exit 183) will be closed from midnight Sunday (May 12) to midnight Thursday (May 16).

Alternate routes will be required such as the I-43/WIS 81 interchange (Exit 185 A-B).

The northbound interchange ramps will remain open.

In the Janesville area, daytime and nighttime noise is anticipated until late May 2019 as crews remove the old southbound pavement and begin grading operations.

I-39/90 expansion and I-43 reconstruction (Illinois state line to Hart Road; County X/Hart Road to Freeman Parkway), Beloit

Anticipated construction completion: November 2019

All I-39/90 traffic shifted onto the southbound side, between Cranston Road and the Illinois state line.

Two lanes remain open in each direction, separated by a median barrier wall.

Updated: Access remains open to the Beloit rest area via temporary ramp connections.

Be alert for crossovers, don't tailgate and drive with caution through this area.

All I-43 traffic located on the southbound side (County X/Hart Road to I-39/90) until mid-August 2019.

One lane open in each direction on I-43, separated by a median barrier wall.

Only a phone number is required to opt in.


The telephone town hall event will last 1 hour.
