The Pulaski County Sheltered Workshop is a non-profit company, classified as a Sheltered Workshop. However, we feel that we are so much more than just a "Sheltered Workshop!"

The Pulaski County Sheltered Workshop is a business dedicated to providing meaningful and productive employment for Differently Abled individuals with both physical and mental developmental disabilities.

The Mission provides a suitable, fun, family oriented and GOD loving place for differently abled individuals to be employed and receive a variety of opportunities to make choices and realize their goals, accomplishments and achievements.

The Woodshop was opened up about 5 years ago and since then they have been awarded contracts with the Waynesville School District, several loyal returning customers as well as local Headstarts. They also have a few signature items that they create on a daily basis. They are known for their Adirondack chairs and flag cases.

The workshop employs over 40 differently abled individuals. Most of the work performed at the workshop is from long term contracts that they hold with NET, 3M, Radians and now Precision Cut. Since the year 2007 the workshop employees have filled and shipped out over 6 million Easter Eggs that are




distributed all over the United States.

Jessie E. McCully MEMORIAL LIBRARY



For the community of Dixon, the library has been a hub for generations of children and families. Starting when the library was organized in 1941, and continuing operation today, the Jessie E. McCully Memorial Library (JEMM) has served as both a meeting place and a starting place for those who love books, reading, and sharing.

Originally housed in the Legion Hall and City Hall before moving to its present location in the Lion's Club Park (200 South Pine), JEMM has been the product of the Dixon Community and its leaders from the outset. The building was completed in 1952 by donations and volunteer labor of the Boy Scouts under the leadership of E. P. Kreiser and J. D. Plunkett. At that time, the building was used by the library and the scouts. The library was named and dedicated in honor of Jessie E. McCully, who along with Mrs. A. J. Crider, were active in the early operation of the library.



In 2017, the library underwent extensive remodeling and updating of the facility, and is now ADA-compliant. By

bringing the library up to today's standards of construction and the material it houses, JEMM is a great place

to obtain both educational and recreational books. However, one can also find videos (DVDs), other printed materials, and there is computer and internet accessibility available.

In 2018, JEMM hosted a Summer Reading Program for its young patrons, and they instituted a very popular Summer Saturday program, with crafts, movies, and other fun things to do each week. In addition, JEMM has been supplied by the

Library Director, Patty Binder, and Assistant Librarian, Tammy Phillips can assist patrons in finding whatever information they are seeking. Hours of operation at JEMM are Tuesday-Friday, 10:30 am- 5:30 p.m., Saturday, 10:00 am- 4:00 p.m.
