

Blue Jay Farm

Approximately two hours west of St. Louis via Interstate 44, there is a quiet retreat with private cabins, just waiting for guests to enjoy the picturesque beauty of Blue Jay Farm. The Goodman family has owned the farm since 1956, and has prepared the perfect place for business and religious retreats, small business reunions, or getaways for couples.

The four cabins for rent are the Rock House, Old Log Cabin, First Cabin, and the Kitchen Cabin. Some will sleep only two, while others may accommodate up to 10 people. Weekly rentals are also available.

The 380-acre private estate is located in the foothills of the Ozark Mountains. Originally, in the early 1900's, Frank Wielandy, one of the founders of the Missouri Department of Conservation, established Blue Jay Farm, recognizing it for the beautiful spot it was for a peaceful refuge.

Today, visitors can enjoy a number of activities such as fishing, canoeing, and swimming in the five-acre spring-fed lake. Guests can also hike on the trails, play ping pong, badminton, or simply take some quiet time to relax and meditate in the serene surroundings.
