and the church quickly got on board with the project. Horsemanship Bible Camp just finished its sixth year of Bible camp during the second week of June. The camp takes place on the Cargill farm, located about three miles south of Swedeborg on Highway T, a short drive from Dixon. Eighty-three campers, ages 9-17 years, from as far west as Kansas, as far north as Kansas City, and as far south

as Arkansas came this year to spend the week at the camp.

The kids bring their own horses, if they have one, and participate in roping and barrel racing, as part of advanced



horsemanship. For those who do not own horses, the kids are offered classes in beginning horsemanship. A total of 125 people were fed at the camp from Tuesday through Saturday, which included approximately 42 volunteers.

Five and one-half hours of the day are spent in the arena, working with the horses, and the camp offers Bible study sessions both in the morning and in the afternoon. Horsemanship Bible Camp also provides an

Although Swedeborg First Baptist hosts the camp, five other churches help sponsor the event: Cowboy Country Church, in Iberia, Harmony Baptist in Waynesville, Ulman Baptist, Westside Baptist of Waynesville, and Eureka Baptist of Richland.

Two other sponsors for the event are M & M Equipment of Richland, which donates portable panels for horse stalls and around the pens, and East 32 Meat Processing of Lebanon, which donates the butchering of a hog, providing food for the campers and staff.

Joe and Kristi Cargill's dream may have been a few years until fulfillment, but since its inauguration, Horsemanship Bible Camp has progressively grown.
