

The building at that time was located in St Robert MO and permission was given to move the church license to Dixon. The church has been served by a number of pastors over several years and the first vacation bible school was conducted at the church in 1964. The church is non denominational and serves the local people in the surrounding community, thus not affiliated or tied to any denomination headquarters.

FIRE BAPTIZED HOLINESS CHURCH

The Fire Baptized Holiness Church began its roots in the Dixon community in 1918 after a revival conducted in Rolling Heath by Rev. C. C. Hamm and Rev. and Mrs. Dowty thus starting a group worship in the Union Church until that building burned. Services after that were conducted in homes and at the Dry Creek Schoolhouse. In 1925 the group was able to afford a new building and it was constructed in the vicinity of the Dry Creek area and was named the Dry Creek Mission. The church had many pastors over the years and in 1949 the church was organized in Dixon under its current name.

SHEPPARD BAPTIST CHURCH

Sheppard Baptist Church was organized in 1946 and Rev. Emmitt Manes was the first pastor. The building that Sheppard Church occupied at the time was originally a Methodist Chapel however, an agreement between the two congregations reached and the building became the Sheppard Baptist Church. In 1963 land was purchased on highway 28. The present building is the new home for the congregation. Since that time, additional classrooms have been added and a new auditorium was built.

WEYLEYAN HOLINESS (HEPHZIBAH)

The Wesleyan Holiness Church saw its beginning in 1959 under Rev. and Mrs. Edwin Hauck and Rev. and Mrs. A. B. Atwell. Victor Gibson was the pastor for two years and upon his departure the church disbanded for several years. In 1966 the church reorganized as a mission under the oversight of Wesleyan Holiness Association of Churches with Headquarters in Phoenix AZ. John Sander then became the next full time pastor of the church and a new building was constructed to hold the faithful worshippers. In 1978, the church reformed under a new name of Hephzibah and a building was constructed on South Pine in Dixon where it is currently located today. The church sends out missionaries and in 1982, a camp was constructed for retreats.

PISGAH BAPTIST CHURCH

The Pisgah Baptist Church is one of the oldest Baptist Churches in Pulaski County, established in 1835. Many of the historical records were destroyed in a fire and other records were moved to other locations, since lost. The location the church was established on was a place known as Matthews Prairie which was named after Wesley Matthews who served and died in the Civil war in the Battle of Wilson Creek located southwest of Springfield MO. In 1935 services were held in different homes and a double log house. The current building was constructed in 1893 and people travelled from all over the four county area, some by oxcart to attend the sermons. The building has been modernized over the years and continues to change with time.

BURNETT FUNDEMENTAL CHRISTIAN CHURCH

In 1952 Rev. Earl and Grace Jones came back to MO after living in various locations and he was looking to establish a fundamental non-denominational church. After providing sermons in the Dixon area for several years, a divot following began to form and the Burnett School was purchased for the new ministry. In the 1960's it was decided that a new building would be needed to suit the needs of the church as it expanded. The amount of \$600.00 was borrowed and a new addition was built onto the church. Missionaries support was provided on a regular basis and in 1975 a decision was made to expand the church even more to meet the needs of the congregation.
