St. James United Church of Christ in Barnesville hired a new church secretary. Allan (Al) Skramstad began his duties as office manager December 1, 2018.

"I like detail and working with numbers," said Skramstad. "Everyday is a learning experience and that is the way I look at it, I am not a know it all. I am working at learning all the idiosyncrasies.

"Detail and attention to the little things, is one of the skills that I am still working at for the church."

Al and his wife, Merron (Kay), have three adult children. They lost a daughter in 2002 to an automobile accident. The couple has eight grandchildren. All of their children and grandchildren reside in the Minneapolis area.

Skramstads have been residents of West Fargo since 1996 and of the Fargo Moorhead area since 1969.

Skramstad owned a small business, Aviation Instructor and Management Seminars, Inc., (AIMS) which conducted weekend aviation training.

He still teaches weekend aviation classes, about six or seven a year and also some flight instruction classes as well. Skramstad has been a licensed pilot and flight instructor since the mid 1980s.

Prior to retirement Skramstad was a tenured associate professor of aviation at the University of North Dakota where he worked for 17 years, retiring in 2008.

Skramstads have been members of Hope Lutheran Church in Fargo since 1983. "All of our children went to Sunday School and were confirmed there," said Skramstad. "Two of our daughters were married there and our deceased daughter went through her funeral service there."

Skramstad spent four and a half years serving as a member of West Fargo Public Schools.

The couple has owned a seasonal summer home on an area lake since 1981. "We enjoy our children and grandchildren visiting during the summer, water skiing, fishing and other outdoor activities.

"Three granddaughters and a grandson like to fish and many times will do better than their grandparents," exclaimed Skramstad.

The commute to Barnesville does not bother Skramstad. "I commuted from West Fargo to Grand Forks for 17 years. I only missed work about a half dozen times due to inclement weather, outside of the flood in 1997," he said.

Skramstad is fairly familiar with Barnesville since he and his family members have been coming to Potato Days for several years. The family also passes through on their way to the lake.

"I enjoy fishing with my wife and several of our grandchildren," Skramstad. "Surprisingly, said my granddaughters enjoy fishing more than the grandsons, with the exception of one grandson. When he comes to the lake, his first question is when can we go fishing.

"I also enjoy a fall hunting trip with my son and two son-in-laws to North Central Montana where we have some very good family friends.

"St. James is a small congregation which makes my job a lot easier starting at the busiest time of the church year. I enjoy the people I work with. Everybody pitches in with the 'we are all family' attitude," concluded Skramstad.
