"VFW stands for Very Few Workers!" joked Hufnagel.

Ideas are bounced around among members which leads to planning, setting up, preparation and serving. Dinners are advertised by means of posters, newspaper and media contacts.

"In recent years it has become increasingly difficult to contact members for volunteer help if they do not have telephone directory listing," stated Hufnagel.

Between the Post and Auxiliary there are approximately 280 members. However, many of the men and women are getting older. It continues to be a challenge to attract younger members

"It is a goal to remain a viable business on Front Street and to be accommodating to our membership We want to serve Veterans and their families as well as the community of Barnesville in any way possible.

For every Veteran, there are eight people who qualify for Auxiliary membership.

Men were welcomed into the Auxiliary several years ago. Spouses, even widow or widower spouse, parents, grandparents, sons, daughters, grandchildren, brothers and sisters are eligible for membership through a Veteran who has served in any foreign war.

The objects of the Auxiliary is fraternal, patriotic, historical,

charitable and educational; to assist the Posts and members whenever possible; to maintain true allegiance to the government of the United States and fidelity to its constitution and laws. Finally to foster true patriotism and maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom and equal rights and justice to all men and women. The role of both the VFW and Auxiliary is to preserve and defend the United States of America from all her enemies.

Most of the current members served in Vietnam or Korea while in military service.

When a Post's charter is pulled, the Auxiliary must follow although National is presently "talking" about allowing Auxiliaries to stand alone in the future.

The VFW and Auxiliary really strive to continue to be a vital part of the Barnesville community.

Post 4628 is a member of Barnesville Main Street Program and supports Showcase and Show N Shine. The facility is open to Potato Day events.

The VFW alternates with the American Legion to plan the annual Memorial Day and Veterans Day observances in Barnesville.

The VFW also has scholarship opportunities for local youth. The Auxiliary works with Thursday Nite Lions helping with the annual Halloween party for children. The annual father and daughter Butterfly Dance is another activity they promote.

The Auxiliary helps sponsor (Law Enforcement Appreciation Day) every January 9. Donations are given to Friends of the Library; Miss Barnesville program; and usually any other worthwhile cause requesting monetary support.

Bi-monthly bingo sessions are sponsored at Valley Care and Golden Manor to provide entertainment for

Every Memorial Day week end the Auxiliary places approximately 500 flags on the graves of veterans. Over \$1,000 is donated every year to veterans causes including the Fargo VA Hospital and Fergus Falls Veterans Home.

The VFW and Auxiliary also contribute to other funds across the country including the National Home for Children in Eaton Rapids, MI; Armed Forces Service Center; Freedom Flight POW/MIA hot air balloon awareness; Gladys Ray House; Fisher House; Wreaths Across America; Veterans and Family Support; and Cancer Grant Fund.

The Cancer Grant Fund supports members coping with cancer and endeavors to provide a gas card to community members known to be incurring expenses for cancer treatment.

It is estimated 22 soldiers take their lives every day thus Suicide Prevention Awareness is promoted.

Last spring the Auxiliary sponsored a very successful spaghetti feed with all proceeds going to the Brian Oberg Legacy Foundation for addition to the group. veterans coping with PTSD.
