



Raiders Show Youth And Experience



In 2018 alone, there were 8.9 million registrations for 5k races around the United States, the most popular distance by far, attracting old and young, veteran runners and new runners. For the casual racer, they may run one, maybe two, 5k events each year. But for cross country athletes, that is their bread and butter. A 5k is the same distance expected out of the harriers every meet. And the LPA Raiders are looking to get across the finish line

The Raiders return 40 percent of their roster this year, giving some strong leadership to a young team. There are just two seniors on the team, Tyler Bjerke and Paul DeBlieck, both serving as captains this season. But the nice thing about this LPA Raider team is that, yes, these boys and the rest of the harriers want to improve their own times, but they are very supportive of each other along the way.

Also rooting for them this year is first-year head coach Sammi Sapa. Sapa brings energy to the coaching staff and is eager to keep pushing these harriers toward their individual and team goals. Sapa will be assisted by Annie Minske.

While the Raiders technically just started their cross country season in mid-August, this sport requires year-long training and dedication. Co-captain Zeb Lewis, junior, has definitely shown that.

"He is a motivating teammate," stated Sapa, "and he gives 100 percent."

In addition to Bjerke and Lewis, other returners to the Lake Park-Audubon harriers include juniors Korey Smigelsky and Tomas Hoffman and freshmen Taylor Johnson and Seth Torgerson.

Sapa and the Raider crew are looking forward to an exciting season. She's been impressed the most by the collaborative, team-first effort the cross country runners have shown early on. The main drive is to continue to set personal records and reach goals, but do so in a way that helps the whole team, focusing on positivity and encouragement.

That will be beneficial considering the onslaught of new athletes they have on their squad this year. There is a good mix of veteran and novice experience as well as high school and junior high ages. But it isn't just the juniors and seniors that are setting the pace.

Freshman Taylor Johnson has been notable in the beginning stages of the cross country season.

"He gives 100 percent in everything he does," Sapa said. "He is young, but already a great leader."

Having a freshman who naturally steps up and gives his best is a huge asset to the Raiders as half their squad are freshmen or younger. It makes that work ethic accessible and immediate. Coupling that with what the juniors and seniors have put out already makes Lake Park-Audubon tough competition.

While they may be a dark horse in a very competitive section as well as the Pine to Prairie Conference, they have the right work ethic, a strong energy from both athletes and coaches, and a belief that anything is possible. LPA kicks off their season on Thursday, August 29 at Breckenridge and then rolls around to Detroit Lakes the following week.

The Lake Park-Audubon Lady Raiders have been on a slow, steady climb over the past few years despite turnover at the coaching position. The program itself has grown as has the success it has seen. With a young season that started mid-August, and the first competition happening before the calendar turns over to September, the Lady Raiders are ready to hit the ground running.

Sammi Sapa is taking the reigns as head coach this season. Sapa has invested herself into this program and is looking to make it and the individual athletes stronger, better, and more confident in their skills on

"I want to help my runners achieve their own personal goals," stated Sapa. But she doesn't stop there. "I'd love to have some state participation again this year."

Last year Taytum Nelson qualified for the state meet as an eighth grader. Nelson finished 72nd out of 175 harriers from across Minnesota. Nelson ran the 5k race in 20:15.8, less than three minutes off the medalist's pace and just 15 seconds shy of breaking into the top 50. Nelson is going into this year, hungry to qualify again and hopeful to bring some teammates with her.

"Taytum has put a lot of time into her summer training," said Sapa. "She is very motivated to do well and is great at supporting her teammates.'

Another leader on the team this year is sophomore Beth Schauer. She has been an integral part of the team for a few years and has grown into her leadership role.

Sapa noted that Schauer is "one of the hardest workers you will ever meet. She always has a positive attitude and a smile on her face. But don't let the smile fool you; she's a competitor!"

Serving as captain for the Lady

Raiders is junior Grace Schauer. The Schauer sisters bring years of experience and leadership to the LPA harrier program, along with freshman Taytum Nelson. The other returner expected to be at the front of the pack is sophomore Gracie Johnson.

And for as much as it is an individual sport, it is a team sport as well. It is always easier to run with someone than by yourself. These girls, while continuing to individually improve, push and encourage each other to be better every practice, every day. This collaboration is contagious and, when paired with the energy Coach Sapa is bringing, don't be surprised in the Lady Raiders make some waves this season.

LPA does sit in a tough conference, Pine to Prairie, and a tough section with teams like the

Perham Yellowjackets, perennial state qualifiers and championship contenders, consistently in their mix. But the Lady Raiders are ready to rise to the challenge and are excited about seeing good competition all "I am excited.
