Barnesville Volleyball Eager To Prove In 2019



The Barnesville Lady Trojans volleyball team has returned for another season of action after a successful 2018 campaign that saw the team finish with an overall record of 23 wins and seven losses, losing a nail biter to New York Mills in the Sub-Section 6A championship that ended their

Halverson and Sorenson also saw some significant playing time a year ago with Halverson netting Rookie of the Year and Sorenson tallying Most Improved Player.

These five players will be looked upon to lead Coach Askegaard's squad, providing the leadership needed for the team to come together early in the season.


