Sebeka School will have a new look in 2019

The first phase of construction of a \$12.5 million building project for the Sebeka School District is well on the way to completion.

The Phase I addition will provide seven regular classrooms, two special education modules, an expanded business education classroom, an expanded choir room, a career counseling center, other administrative space and a boiler room.

The District’s construction management team is projecting a fully finished structure by the end of March if everything goes as planned.

One thing is for sure, students will be using the new addition in the coming school year,

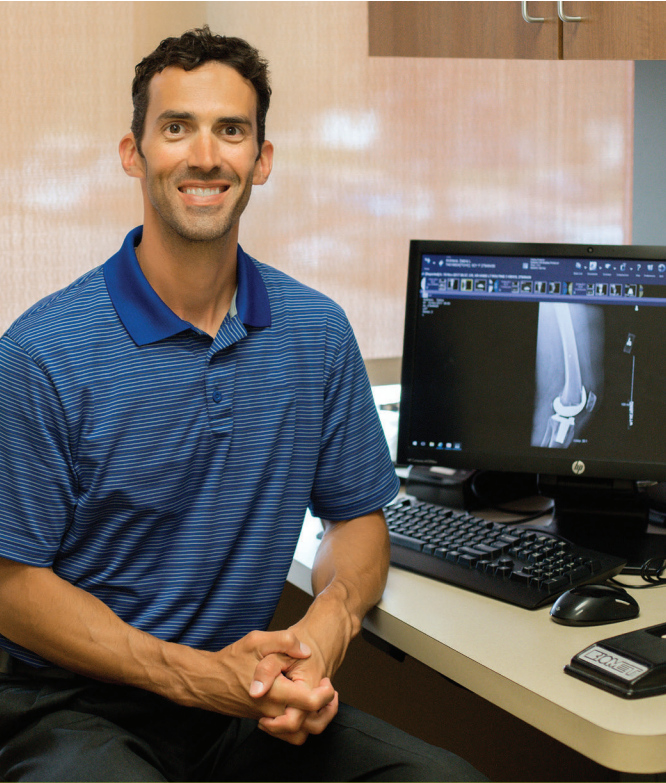
since Phase II construction begins with the demolition of the old 1928-31 structure. Once completed this addition will feature a new gymnasium, a large lobby/commons area, a weight room, new locker rooms, administrative office space and storage space.

Once completed, the 41,484 square foot project represents the first major voter-approved building update in more than 30 years for the Sebeka District.

In addition to the construction funded by the \$12.5 million referendum, the district will undertake some HVAC updates to the rest of the campus that will funded by other revenue sources, but those plans have not been finalized.
