### NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER GRANTING A PROPOSED PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENT

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the School Board of Independent School District No. 308 (Nevis Public School), Nevis, Minnesota (the "District") will hold a public hearing on June 24, 2019, at approximately 7:00 o'clock p.m., in the Media Center at the Nevis School, 210 Pleasant Street W, Nevis, MN 56467, to consider granting an abatement of certain property taxes levied against net tax capacity imposed by the District (the "Proposed Property Tax Abatement") for taxes payable in 2020 through 2024 on the following properties within the District boundaries:

The purpose of granting the Proposed Property Tax Abatement is to provide funds to finance construction of and improvements to District parking lots and related work, and related financing costs. The total estimated amount of the Proposed Property Tax Abatement by the District is \$104,479 over five (5) years, an amount estimated to be sufficient to pay the principal and interest on \$95,000 of bonds issued to finance the parking lot projects, and related financing costs.

All who wish to be heard as to the Proposed Property Tax Abatement will be given an opportunity to express their views at the time of the public hearing or may file written comments with the Superintendent prior to the public hearing.

## Ask a Trooper

**Question:** Moped rentals are being considered in my city. Can you talk about the laws and rules that cover moped operations and if insurance is required on them? What is the difference between a moped and motor scooter?

**Answer:** Great question as I am starting to see more mopeds on our roadways.

A moped is a vehicle that is propelled by a motor of a capacity of 50cc or less, and a maximum of two brake horse power, which is capable of a maximum speed of not more than 30 mph on a flat surface.

Any person who has a valid Minnesota driver's license may operate a moped without taking the moped test. Anyone without a driver's license, regardless of age, must obtain a moped operator's permit. Additional information about moped permit requirements is online in the Motorcycle Manual.

A motorized foot scooter is capable of no more than 15 mph and has no more than two 12-inch or smaller diameter wheels. All operators of motorized foot scooters must be 12 years of age or older to operate one legally. No pas-

sengers may ride on motorized foot scooters.

When operating a moped or motorized bike in Minnesota, you must follow the following moped-specific rules:

- You may not ride on bicycle lanes, trails, or interstate freeways.
- You must operate as close to the right side of the road as possible.
- You must wear a helmet if you are younger than 18 years old.
- The moped must have a working headlight and tail-light for nighttime operation.
- If you are younger than 16 years old, you may not ride with passengers unless the passenger is a parent/guardian.

Also, mopeds must be registered in Minnesota. A title of proof of sale of the moped is required to register it, along with a photo. Mopeds are required to have license plates and proof of motorcycle liability insurance.

- Out with a Honda dirt bike.
- Caller states that an older pontoon is by his dock. Unknown if it was abandoned there or if it washed up on shore.
- Tree fell from storm. It is protruding into the roadway approximately four feet.
- Caller had two stray dogs in her yard. She caught one of the dogs and the other dog took off. Caller would like to speak with an officer regarding what to do with the animal.
- Property line dispute.
- ATV violation. Verbal warning for no headlight.
- Squad vs. deer. Deer off roadway.
- Ambulance for 59 year old male possibly has a broken arm.
- Owner just returned from the Cities and his barn has burned down.
- Three black with white spots cows on the Heartland Trail.
- Dead deer in the roadway obstructing traffic.
- Caller reports that an individual came on to her property and agitated her dogs.
- Gunshots from the Wejack area.

### How to collect your sample:

- Bring at least one-half cup of water in a Ziploc-type

bag or clean container. In order to get a good sample, allow the water to run five minutes before filling the bag. Homeowners with distillators, reverse osmosis or other nitrate removal systems should take two water samples – one before and one after the treatment process. This will determine if the nitrate removal system is working. Homeowners with just a water softener need to take one sample, either before or after the water passes through the water softener.

- Samples are analyzed on the spot and the process takes less than five minutes. Results will be given directly to the homeowner.

## In History ...

June 14, 1775 - The first U.S. Military service, the Continental Army consisting of six companies of riflemen, was established by the Second Continental Congress. The next day, George Washington was appointed by a unanimous vote to command the army.

June 14, 1777 - John Adams introduced a resolution before Congress mandating a United States flag, stating, "...that the flag of the thirteen United States shall be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white on a blue field, representing a new constellation." This anniversary is celebrated each year in the U.S. as Flag Day.

June 14, 1922 - Warren G. Harding became the first U.S. President to broadcast a message over the radio. The event was the dedication of the Francis Scott Key Memorial in Baltimore.

June 14, 1951 - Univac 1, the world's first commercial electronic computer was unveiled in Philadelphia. It was installed at the Census Bureau and utilized a magnetic tape unit as a buffer memory.
