Nevis Public School Regular School Board Meeting, June 24, 2019

The Board of Independent School District 308 met on Monday, June 24, 2019, in the Media Center, Chair Larry Smith called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Members present included Ed Becker, Justin Isaacson, Andy Lindow, Larry Smith, Maggie Stacey, and Gary Stennes.

Motion by Ed Becker, second by Maggie Stacey to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Superintendent Parks gave a Power Point presentation addressing the tax abatement process to finance \$95,000.00 over a five-year period as part of the parking lot project. Matt Hammer from Ehlers & Associates, Inc., the District's financial advisors, was in attendance to answer any questions

Motion by Andy Lindow, second by Gary Stennes to approve the minutes of the regular school board meeting held May 28, 2019, as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Ed Becker, second by Maggie Stacey to approve the financial reports as presented by Superintendent Parks including the Payment Register and payment of claims in the amount of \$217,951.64. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Justin Isaacson, second by Ed Becker to approve the following consent agenda items: donations as follows -

Nevis Lumber - \$33.40, Industrial Technology Supplies,

The Benevity Community Impact Fund - \$145.65, Robotics with total donations in the amount of \$179.05; resignation of Andrew Dahlby, high school science teacher, effective June 24, 2019; overnight field trip request for robotics off-season competition in Duluth July 18-20; and 2019-2020 gasoline quote from Luetgers Oil Company (T&M Express) for a six-cent per gallon discount off the posted price. Motion carried unanimously. Well wishes were extended to Mr. Dahlby with thanks for his years of service and dedication to the students of Nevis

Motion by Gary Stennes, second by Andy Lindow to approve the renewal for insurance and risk management insurance with VAALAR Insurance for 2019-2020 at a cost of \$89,827 to the District. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Ed Becker, second by Justin Isaacson to approve a resolution providing for the sale of general obligation facilities maintenance and tax abatement bonds, series 2019A. Motion carried unanimously. Not to exceed \$285,000, the funds will be used for window replacement and other targeted capital improvements on the district's 10-year, long-term facilities maintenance plan.

Motion by Andy Lindow, second by Maggie Stacy to approve the 2019-2020 budget as presented by Superintendent Parks with revenues in the amount of \$7,922,327.00 and expenditures in the amount of \$8,009,819.00. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Andy Lindow, second by Ed Becker to approve a contract with McKenzie Harris as School Readiness instructor for the 2019-2020 school year. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Ed Becker, second by Justin Isaacson to approve the District's 2020-2030 Long-Term Facilities Maintenance Plan as presented by Superintendent Parks. Motion carried unanimously.

Student representative, Megan Lindow reported the activities and events for the months of June and July which included track athletes participating in the section meet June 1 – Andrea Dudley, Jack Mc-Namee and Jade Rypkema advanced to the state meet held at Hamline University June 7-8. Volleyball camp was held June 11-13 in Tiger Arena, Varsity football camp will be held July 8-10 with their passing tournament scheduled for July 13. And, the robotics team will travel to Duluth for an off-season competition July 18-20.

Principal Michaelson reported the policy committee met June 4 to update policies in the Staff and Student/Parent Handbooks. The 5th-8th grade math curriculum team met June 12 to review the scope and sequence, and to discuss future interventions. Student schedules for grades 7-12 are being finalized. New teachers and mentors will meet August 22. In-service for all staff is scheduled for August 26-29.

Motion by Ed Becker, second by Justin Isaacson to adjourn. The meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m.

Ryan Anthony Burnos, (37), 404 North Main St. W. Apt A, Nevis, MN 56467

On March 18, 2019 at approximately 12:02 a.m. Sergeant Stacey observed a vehicle traveling in the City of Nevis, County of Hubbard, and appeared to be traveling well over the posted speed limit of 30 mph. Sgt. Stacey then followed the vehicle and observed the vehicle go through a stop sign at the intersection of Pleasant St. and 2nd St. N. in the City of Nevis. Sgt. Stacey activated the emergency lights and sirens on his patrol vehicle in an attempt to stop the vehicle. The vehicle sped up failing to stop and traveled onto County Road 18, County Road 7 and County Road 11. During this time the vehicle was traveling at rate of speeds between 70-110 m.p.h. As the vehicle approached the intersection of Hwy. 34 and County 7, the vehicle shut its headlights off and drove through the intersection making no effort to stop for the stop sign. Sgt. Stacey continued to follow the vehicle until the vehicle lost control and sent into the ditch on the west side of the road. The total pursuit was approximately 21 miles long.

Deputy Anderson assisted in getting the driver out of the vehicle, who was identified as Ryan Anthony Burnos. Burnos stated "I'm done." Sgt. Stacey observed Burnos was sweating profusely, his eyes were moving rapidly and he was talking very fast. Sgt Stacey believed Burnos was under the influence of narcotics, based on his training and experience. Sgt. Stacey was aware that Burnos had an active Felony warrant for a probation violation and that Burnos was not to be using controlled substances and subject to

Deputy Anderson transported Burnos to the Hubbard County Law Enforcement Center where Burnos submitted to a probationary drug test which was positive for methamphetamine. Deputy N. Stein later transported Burnos to St. Joseph's Hospital where a blood sample was obtained pursuant to a search warrant. BCA
