- Individual states male caller wanting bail money from grandma. Needing bail money, nothing exchanged. Reporting party wanted it on file they are calling and scamming our area again.
- Boat and water violation. Written warning for no throwable.
- Reporting party states that individual keeps calling and harassing him.
- Motorist assist.
- Reporting party has questions in reference to a neighbor trespassing on his property.
- Reporting a blue/gray older Chevy van in the area. Parks down the road from the reporting party's residence and drives by the house at a slow rate of speed.

- Tractor pulling a trailer has a rate of speed approximately 5 mph. Caller is concerned that the tractor is going to get hit by a vehicle.
- Caller would like to speak with an officer regarding being accused of being a

thief by a family member.

- Two vehicle accident. One party stick inside vehicle. Extrication needed.
- Medical alarm activated three times by a 72 year old female.
- Tree down obstructing the roadway.
- Living room deck motion alarm.
- Resort owner states that a party who is not a guest is fishing on their property. It has been ongoing for the past three days.
- Attempted theft.
- Male party driving fast and on his cell phone.
- Traffic stop with Becker with our wanted subject.
- Cut padlock to cabin and stole keys to pontoon, four-wheeler and storage building. No suspects sometime since July 4.
- Male taking her credit cards and pushed her on the ground.

August 2

- Semi truck broke down partially obstructing the roadway.
- Caller stated there was an 11 year old driving a front end loader through the city of Nevis followed by a parent in a truck.
- Pickup truck ran stop sign and almost hit bicyclist.
- Female party having problems breathing.
- Party in lobby would like to speak with an officer regarding clearing a right of way on a fence line she is installing ten feet onto the neighbor's property.
- Car parked on the island that does not belong to any registered guests.
- Box truck approximately 24 foot in length going 80 mph and swerving.

- Elderly male has fallen and wife is unable to move him on her own. Unknown if injured.

- Two 911 hang ups. No answer on call back.
- Three cows out in the city of Akeley.
- Herd of cows were out on the highway. Reporting party got them off the road and in the field. No fence. Cell phone caller and we lost contact with them during the call.
- Two of the four stop signs have been spray painted over.
- Caller reports heavy smoke in the area. White in color. SP 104 was just through the area and it was fog.
- ATV verbal warning for no headlight.
- Maroon Pontiac Grand Prix all over the road. Heading eastbound.
- Red Ford pickup driving with children in the bed of the truck. Anonymous caller.
- There is a swarm of bees on the stop sign at State 34 and 219th. Caller would like to know what to do or who to contact.
- ATV driving up and down the roadway in the lane of traffic doing wheelies.
- Reporting party had issues with subjects littering on his property.
- Neighbor's are shooting guns. It is scaring the dogs.
- Hit and run in the parking lot.
- Female party wearing all black walking on the edge of the highway westbound by the Dogs Paw.

August 4

- Activated general motion alarm.
- Report of several subjects swimming and being loud.
- Daughter receiving harassing phone calls.
- Reporting purple car. Driver is intoxicated.
- Vehicle was stolen sometime in the past 12 hours.
- Vehicle pulled into caller's driveway with hazard lights flashing. Occupied times one male that is leaning over to the passenger side.
- Fire along Hwy. 71 on the east side of the roadway.

Ask a Trooper

Question: I have a question about signs along the road. I heard somewhere that people are not allowed to put signs along the roadway for graduation parties, political signs and advertising. I see signs for auctions fairly often. Does this apply to them?

Answer: You're correct that signs for graduation parties, political purposes and advertising are not allowed to be placed on the road right-of-way. They would need to be placed on private property.

- As for auction signs, they are allowed but have some requirements under the law. The placement can't exceed eight consecutive hours.
- They can't be placed on or adjacent to the right-of-way of a highway.
- There can be no more than four signs directing motorists to the auction's location.

While the law does not go into detail, the location of auctioneer signs must not endanger the public. Signs on the shoulder of the road or in the radius of a driveway access would not be allowed as they cause safety concerns with sight distance and oncoming traffic. Signs on the shoulder are also unsafe for vehicles traveling along the road.

Signs should be placed toward the back slope where they can still be read by the travelling public. If the signs are posted during weekdays for a Saturday auction, they would be subject to removal.

If you have more questions, you should contact the appropriate local highway department, depending on the type of road (state, county or city.) This would also be the place to contact if your signs were removed by local authorities or technicians for pick up.
