Son of Charleston church shooting victim to talk 'hope & healing' Feb. 9

Three and a half years ago a white supremacist shot and killed nine worshippers in a Charleston church, and the son of one of those victims will share his thoughts in five different forums in McCormick early next month.

"South Carolina and the world was shocked by the racially motivated murders of those nine people at Emanuel AME Church," said Pastor Jim Kinsler of the McCormick County Community Relations Council.

Singleton will also speak to McCormick sch

"One of those killed was the mother of Chris Singleton, and his message of hope and healing is born out of the pain and tragedy of that horrible event. Listeners will be moved to tears and inspired to action by Chris and

the timeless truth he shares," said Kinsler, Pastor of the Lutheran Church By The Lake.

Singleton is a professional baseball player but considers his "Building Bridges of Hope and Healing" a greater mission. His major appearance is as the keynote speaker at the McCormick County Community Relations Council's annual banquet at 5 p.m., Saturday, Feb. 9 at the McCormick Middle School gymnasium

Singleton will also speak to McCormick school students on Friday, the McCormick County Ministerial Alliance at 9 a.m. Saturday at Hickory Knob State Resort, and at two churches on Sunday, 9:15 a.m. at Lutheran Church By The Lake and 11 a.m. at Shiloh AME.

Dr. Tucker worked as a medical technologist at Comanche County Memorial Hospital for 35 years and also worked as a registrar for the New Life Bible School. She has served in ministry for more than 25 years and finally accepted the call on her life in 2009.

Dr. Tucker served as an ordained elder and minister at New Life Fellowship in Lawton, Olka., until she returned to McCormick three and one half years ago. Dr. Tucker presently serves as the senior pastor of Holy Spring Baptist Church in McCormick. She has been licensed and ordained by the Savannah Goodwill Associa-

Pastor Tucker currently holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Biblical Studies, a Masters of Arts in Biblical Studies, Master of Divinity in Pastoral Care and Doctorate of Theology Degree from Minnesota School of Theology.
