

New online programs for adults in McCormick

Edgefield-McCormick County Adult Education presents a new opportunity for McCormick County residents to learn and improve literacy skills at their own pace. The online programs will assist adult learners by preparing them to earn their GED diploma, computer literacy, and career readiness certification. The program is specifically designed for adults who live in rural areas or have busy schedules. The programs also allow the learner to study from the comforts of their home, and the use of a mobile device to improve skills.

This blended learning platform allows the student to actively engage in preparation for the GED tests, improve computer skills and Workplace Learning using the WIN System. Each learning opportunity includes instructional support from a certified teacher. The teacher is trained to respond to any technical or learning issue the student may have while using the online programs. The student will also be given the opportunity to participate in the GED test for free. This is a \$150 value for becoming an online student through the program.

According to Vickie Butler, program director, "the goal of the program is to increase learning accessibility to McCormick County adult learners and prepare them for future opportunities. She adds no one will

be denied an opportunity to complete their education or prepare for a career because of location."

She adds "computerized learning and interactions have become a part of our daily existence. The programs have built-in interactive and incentivized lessons intended for adults and are based on how they learn best. Not only are the lessons customized to how the learner learns, but they are designed to keep the learner interested and moving forward."

There are program requirements that potential students must fulfill prior to enrolling in the class. These requirements include:

- Must be at least 17 years old or older and withdrawn from high school
- Attend Registration and Orientation (\$25 non-refundable fee)
- Internet access
- Hold a South Carolina valid ID

All students are required to take the Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE) pre and post-assessment when enrolled in the program. Once the student is enrolled, he or she must access the online program weekly and commit to studying four to six hours per week. Cats, cats and more cats!

You may know that the Humane Society of McCormick County is doing a great job taking care of all the homeless cats (and dogs!) in McCormick, but have you ever wondered about how much work goes into providing care for so many cats on a DAILY basis?

The HSMC cat team has broken down the daily tasks into five different areas all of which are currently in need of additional volunteers. All are essential to the program and all will leave volunteers with the knowledge that they have made a difference in the lives of hundreds of cats and kittens.

The first area in need is the "Community Cats" program which provides daily morning feedings to seven small cat colonies within the town of McCormick. Some cats are outgoing while others are shy and watch from a safe distance. But all meow in appreciation to have a meal and clean water served up fresh, seven days a week. Potential volunteers should be willing to make a one to two hour a week commitment.

The "AM Clean and Feed Shift" is the second area in need and takes place at the "Cat Haven" on HSMC's refuge site. Every morning a team of two volunteers feeds the cats and kittens at the haven and cleans their areas. Some days require a full clean of litter boxes while others may just need a "sift." You may be asked to throw in a load or two of laundry while you work and if there is extra time wash a few windows smudged by curious noses and playful paws. Interested volunteers should be able to commit to four to five hours a week.

Afternoons/early eves are home to the third area, the "Sift and Play" shift where one volunteer will come to the Haven to do the final visit of the day. Litter boxes get a quick "sift", kittens are fed and adult kitties get treats. All get some fun play time. Volunteers should expect one to two hours a week of commitment.

If you love cats but can't commit to a weekly schedule, then you might consider the forth option "Adoption Day," which takes place at PetSmart and Petco in Aiken (during normal store hours) on Saturdays and requires a one day per month commitment. Volunteers help load kitties hoping for a forever home into the van and make the drive to Aiken. Once at the store, you will help unload the precious cargo then be available to meet potential adopters, answer questions and make sure the person/family will be a good fit. Follow-up measures are taken to make sure all is well in the new home and that any remaining medical needs are completed. Adoptions are a VITAL part of the cat program and enable HSMC to continue to accept new kittens and cats into the haven.

The fifth and final area in need asks for a four hour a month commitment spent having fun-fun-fun! The bi-monthly "Cat Cafe" is held Sundays at the Cat Haven and affords visitors the opportunity to play with the cats and kittens while indulging in some sweet refreshments. This is not only fun time for the cats, it also helps them overcome any shyness around people and feel more comfortable at adoption days. Volunteers may elect to help out by baking a treat or greet visitors and answer questions. While this is just a day of fun for the kitties, sometimes a visitor might fall in love and become a new cat mom or dad.

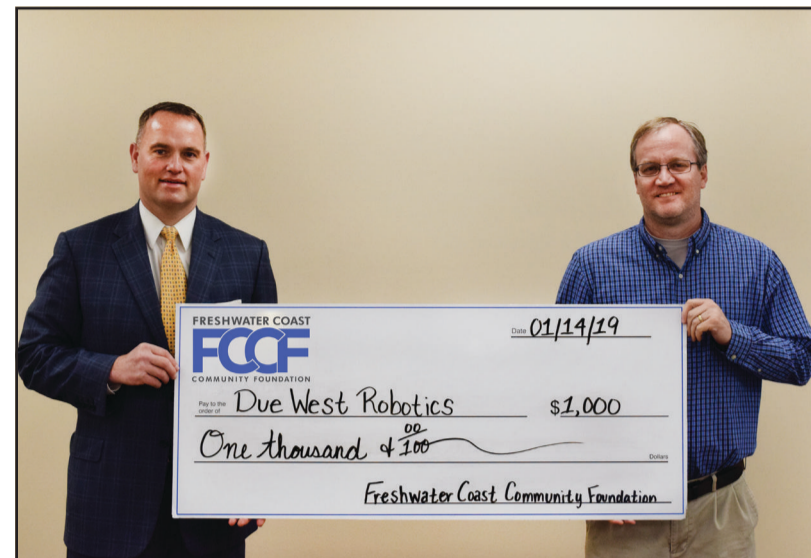
The Freshwater Coast Community Foundation (FCCF) donated \$1,000 to the Due West Robotics Club in honor of Lee W. Logan.
