Real Faith For Real Life

From The Pastor's Pen:

Good Friday is quickly approaching... the day that Jesus was crucified. How can the crucifixion of the Son of God be "good"? Why do we take the time to pause on Friday to remember His brutal execution on a Roman cross? Because our Heavenly Father had a plan for Jesus AND He has a plan for you.

Why did Jesus have to die? Isaiah 53:5 says, "But He was pierced because of our transgressions, crushed because of our iniquities; punishment for our peace was on Him, and we are healed by His

God created us to be in relationship with Him. Every day He would walk with Adam and Eve. That was His plan for us. But sin got in the way. Sin separated us from God because He cannot and will not fellowship with sin.

But, the fall of man in the Garden of Eden wasn't the end of the story. God promised a Messiah, one who would redeem us to God, one who would be pierced because of our transgressions, one who would be crushed because of our iniquities. Jesus took our punishment upon Himself, and it is by His wounds that we are healed!

That day on the cross, God's creation cried out in pain when the sinless Son of God was crucified. Why? Because when my sin (and yours) was taken upon Jesus, our Heavenly Father turned away from

Why would He do that? Remember, God cannot and will not fellowship with sin. For the only time in all of eternity the Father was separated from His son... and all because He was willing to take our sin upon himself to pay the price (death) for it.

The earth shook and the sky turned dark in the middle of the day because of the agony of this separation. The love of Jesus for you sent Him to that cross. Psalm 22 gives a detailed view of what the Messiah would go through, describing crucifixion in stark detail even though it had not yet been invented.

As Jesus' side was pierced with the spear, the Bible tells us that "blood and water" poured out. Medically, the reason for this is that crucifixion forces congestive heart failure that causes a chamber of the heart to burst.

On the cross that day, Jesus died. When the Son of God took my sin (and yours) upon Himself, he literally died from a broken heart. What could be good about that? Jesus was obedient to the Father to the point of death, even the death of a cross. He fulfilled God's plan.

On Sunday, the work culminated with the resurrection of Jesus in victory over sin... in victory over hell... in victory over the grave! Through the forgiveness that comes by faith in Christ, once again we can walk with God every day! God has a plan for you.

Friday was dark and the disciples couldn't fully understand all that was happening. But on Sunday they found the risen Lord! You might not understand the things that God is doing in your life right now. It might be dark. It might be Friday. But know that God has a plan for you, and Sunday's coming!!


