Tyra Wingler sets school record in girls' discus at triangular meet

It was a great night for a great throw, and the Knights' Tyra Wingler made the most of the opportunity. She had been inching towards the ALAH school record in the discus throw since last year, and at the Tuesday night triangular meet at Wilson Field, she not just made the mark but shattered it.

Wingler's toss of 120'4" bested the previous school record of 111'7" set by Karly Goodman in 2013. Goodman went on after high school to earn All-American status, both indoors and outdoors, in the weight throws at Illinois Wesleyan University. She holds several school records for the Titans at IWU.

In the meet as a whole, the Knights' girls held off Sangamon Valley by just two points to take first place in the team standings. Individuals besides Wingler earning first at the competition were Shaylie Miller, 100-meter dash; Alexa Miller, 200-meter dash and long jump.

The red, black and gold's 4 x 100-meter relay and 4 x 200-me-

ter relay each finished first as well.

On the boys' side, there were several fine performances at the meet. Earning individual first place finishes were Finnian Davison, 200-meter dash; Adam Day, 400-meter dash; Austin Romine, 800-meter run; Keaton Korando, 300-meter hurdles.

ALAH nearly swept the relay events, winning the 4 x 100-, 4 x 200-, and 4 x 400-meter relays.

As a team, the Arthur Lovington Atwood Hammond High School boys finished second in the three-team meet.

After another washed out game on Monday scheduled for Monday against Blue Ridge, the Knights versus the Knights baseball game finally was able to be played on Wednesday at Corum Field in Arthur. It was a close contest, and the best part was the "good" Knights won!

The game was scoreless through four and one half innings of play before Arthur Lovington Atwood Hammond got on the board in the fifth inning to lead 1-0.

Even though that would be all ALAH pitcher Lucas Otto would need that afternoon, his teammates helped give the Knights' lead some padding in the sixth inning by pushing three more runs across the plate.

The 4-0 lead stood up, and another conference win was chalked up for the league-leading ALAH.

Each team had four hits, but the red, black, and gold made the most of theirs in the contest. Blue Ridge had two errors in the game while the home team was perfect in the field.

Otto once again was outstanding from the mound, pitching a complete game shutout. He stymied opposing batters, striking out 11 while only issuing three walks.

Brayden Fay and Nik Miller had two walks each in the game. Scott McClain recorded an RBI for the Knights.

The next night, Arthur Lovington Atwood Hammond faced off against Arcola in another Little Okaw Valley Conference matchup. It was one of those games if you just saw the final score, you would have thought the Knights cruised to another win, but that was far from the case.

ALAH scratched out two runs, one each in the second and third stanzas, to take a 2-0 lead. The Purple Riders came back with two runs of their own in the bottom half of the fourth inning to tie the game at 2-2.

In the home half of the fifth, Arcola struck again with two more runs to take the lead for the first time in the contest, 4-2. The purple crew had the momentum and were thinking upset at that stage of the game.

The Knights did not panic, though, and came back with three runs in the top of the sixth to go ahead 5-4. After a line drive took the starting Riders pitcher out of the game, Arcola simply ran out of gas. ALAH hammered the relief pitching for seven runs in the seventh inning to go up 12-4 which is where the game ended.

Dario Ayala was the starting

pitcher for ALAH, and he threw eight strikeouts in the game. Ryan Yeakley, who was credited with the win, came in to relieve Ayala and closed out the victory for the Knights.

Lucas Otto (including a home run) and Cody Miller had two RBIs for the visitors while ALAH teammate Ayala, Caleb Foster, and Jake Hollingsworth chipped in one run batted in each. The Knights were patient at the plate, too, as Foster walked three times in the game and Ayala took two base on balls in the affair.

"Tonight, our solid pitching and aggressive base running was the difference," said Knights' head coach Bob Silvanik. "Arcola is well coached, and they fought hard, making us battle for 7 full innings. I give both teams a lot of props."

On Saturday, it turned out to be a fine day for baseball in Casey, but it was a rough day for Arthur Lovington Atwood Hammond baseball. The Knights dropped both games of a doubleheader to Casey-Westfield by scores of 6-1 and 6-5. The Warriors are a very good team, and ALAH will certainly seek to rebound this week.

After Saturday, the Knights' overall record for the season was 10-5 while the conference record was 4-0.
