Try these recipes for your Easter brunch.

Country Brunch Skillet

6 slices bacon

6 cups shredded potatoes 3/4-cup chopped green peppers 1/2-cup chopped onions

1 teaspoon salt

6 eggs 1/2-cup shredded cheese

In a large skillet, cook bacon until crisp. Reserve 2 tablespoons drippings. Add potatoes, green peppers, onions, salt, and pepper to drippings. Cook and stir for 2 minutes. Cover and cook for about 15 minutes. Stir occasionally, until potatoes are golden and tender.

With a spoon, make 6 wells into each well. Cover and cook on low heat for 8 to 10 minutes until eggs are completely set. Sprinkle with cheese and bacon. Creamy Ham and

Hash Brown Casserole

One 32-ounce package frozen hash browns

One cup diced ham Two 10.75-ounce cans

cream of potato soup One 16-ounce container

sour cream 2 cups shredded

sharp Cheddar cheese

1 1/2 cups grated Parmesan cheese

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. In a large bowl, combine hash browns, ham, potato soup, sour cream, and Cheddar cheese. Spread mixture into a greased 9 x13 inch baking dish. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Bake for 1 hour or until bubbly and light 3/4-cup mini chocolate chips brown. Let stand for 10 minutes

on a greased pan and reheat until cheese is melted. Onions, peppers, and mushrooms can be sauteed first.

Biscuits & Sausage Gravy One 12-ounce package sausage 3 tablespoons butter

1/4-cup flour 3 cups whole milk

Salt and pepper to taste Prepared biscuits, your choice

In a large skillet over medium-high heat, crumble and cook sausage until browned. Remove sausage from pan, reserve dripter and stir until melted. Stir in flour until smooth. Reduce heat to medium and continue to cook until mixture is a light brown col-

Slowly add milk, whisking as you pour. Continue cooking until thickened. Season with salt and pepper. Stir in cooked sausage. Reduce heat and simmer for 12 to 15 minutes. Serve over biscuits of your choice.

Sweet Potato Pancakes 3/4-pound sweet potatoes

1 1/2 cups all purpose flour 3 1/2 teaspoons baking powder

1 teaspoon salt

1/2-teaspoon ground nutmeg 2 eggs

1 1/2 cups milk

1/4-cup butter

or margarine, melted In a medium pan of boil-

until tender but firm. Drain water and immediately immerse potatoes in cold water to loosen

Drain, remove skins, chop, and mash potatoes.

In a large bowl, combine flour, baking powder, salt, and nutmeg. In a medium bowl, beat together eggs, milk, and butter then mix in sweet potatoes. Add potato mixture to flour mixture and stir until well combined.

On a lightly greased griddle or large skillet over medium-high heat, add a heaping tablespoon of the potato mixture for each pancake. Flatten each pancake with your spatula. Cook on each side until pancakes are browned and

Remove pan from refrigerator and allow to sit for 30 minutes before baking. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Bake covered dish for 30 minutes. Uncover and continue to bake for an additional 30 minutes until golden brown and center is set. Serve casserole with maple syrup.

Cappuccino Muffins

2 cups flour

3/4-cup sugar

2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder 1 teaspoon cinnamon

1/2-teaspoon salt

1 cup milk

2 tablespoons instant coffee

1/2-cup butter, melted

1 egg 1 teaspoon vanilla

Expresso Spread: 4-ounce cream cheese, softened 1/2-teaspoon instant coffee
