Tyler Wingler sets new ALAH HS record in discus throw

It was a great night for a great throw and the Knights Tyra Wingler made the most of the opportunity. She had been inching towards the ALAH school record in the discus throw since last year and at the Tuesday night triangular meet at Wilson Field she not just made the mark but shattered it.

Wingler's toss of 120'4" bested the previous school record of 111'7" set by Karly Goodman in 2013. Goodman went on after high school to earn All-American status, both indoors and outdoors. in the weight throws at Illinois Wesleyan University. She holds several school records for the Titans at IWU.

In the meet as a whole, the Knights girls held off Sangamon Valley by just two points to take first place in the team standings. Individuals besides Wingler earning first at the competition were: Shaylie Miller (100 meter dash); Alexa Miller (200 meter dash, long iump). The red, black and gold's 4x100 meter relay and 4x200 meter relay each finished first as well.

On the boys side, there were several fine performances at the meet. Earning individual first place finishes were: Finnian Davison (200 meter dash); Adam Day (400 meter dash); Austin Romine (800 meter run); Keaton Korando (300 meter hurdles).
