When it comes to pitching and defense in high school baseball, skill and athleticism are a plus, but experience tends to be the separating factor. If that idiom holds true, the GCHS Wildcats should be in pretty good shape for 2020.

Coach Nick Chatham returns all but one member of his core pitching staff from a year and all but three lettermen in the field. Add to that a handful of up-andcomers in key spots and it isn't hard to see why Chatham feels confident about his ability to limit runs by opponents.

Chatham can use him as a starter or as a late inning reliever, an area he showed a lot of promise in last year as he earned two saves. He struck out four in two innings against Laurel and finished out the Cats' win over Petal, getting two outs on seven pitches, including a strikeout to end the game. West could also see time defensively in both the infield and outfield for GCHS this year.

"Malachi came on strong last year as a valuable option for us and had some tremendous starts on the mound in some big games in the playoffs," Chatham said. "As a matter of fact, he won two game three scenarios in the playoffs and those big innings from last year are what makes me confident in him this year. Malachi also plays great in the outfield for us and gets good jumps on the ball and is a good thinker."

"Conner has a very lively arm and a great demeanor on the mound. He is a competitor out there which is why we were able to use him a lot last year on the mound. We threw him into some really tough situations last year as a freshman and he never blinked. We are looking for great things on the mound for Conner this year."


