Payne is a graduate of numerous military schools and courses, including Basic Airborne Course; Ranger Indoctrination Program; Ranger School; Sniper Course; Basic Leader Course; Basic Demolition Course; Advanced Demolition Course; Advanced Land Navigation; Survive, Evasion, Resistance and Escape; Free Fall Parachutist; Advanced Leader Course; Jumpmaster Course; Free Fall Jumpmaster Course; Joint Military Tandem Master Course; Senior Leader Course; Defense Language Institute (French); Special Forces Sniper Course; and Joint Special Operations Senior Enlisted Academy.




Command, grew up in Batesburg-Leesville and Lugoff, South Carolina, and graduated from high school in 2002. Part of the 9/11 generation, Payne felt a strong sense of duty to serve his country. After high school, he enlisted in the Army as an Infantryman 11B and completed the Basic Airborne Course at Fort Benning, Georgia, in 2002 and the Ranger Indoctrination Program (now known as the Ranger Assessment and Selection Program) in early 2003.

He was then assigned as a rifleman to A Co., 1st Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment, where he also served as a sniper and sniper team leader until November 2007, the year he was selected for assignment to the U.S. Army Special Operations Command at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. Since then, he has served within USASOC as a special operations team member, assistant team sergeant, team sergeant and instructor.

In 2012, Payne and his teammate won the Best Ranger Competition – a grueling contest that places extreme demands on buddy teams' physical, mental, technical and tactical skills as Rangers – at Fort Benning.

Throughout his career, Payne deployed 17 times in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation New Dawn and Operation Inherent Resolve, and to the U.S. Africa Command area of responsibility.

Free breakfast, lunch to all LCSD students



The USDA made it possible for School Districts across the Country to serve Breakfast and Lunches at no charge to support families during the Covid-19 Pandemic. This program will be in effect from September 2020 through December 2020 or until funding runs out. The Lancaster County School District's Department of Food services has been planning for this event and look forward to serving as many students that will participate with us. All of the schools of Lancaster County School District are considered closed sites and will only serve registered students that attend a K-12 program within the District.

Our plan is as follows:

A/B Day students

We plan to serve students free at no charge Breakfast and Lunch on every day that they physically attend school with us. In addition, we plan to send 3 Breakfast and 3 Lunches home with students on Tuesdays and Fridays of each week to support the 3 days in which they are not physically attending school with us and are at home.

Virtual students

Instructions to access these free meals are as follows.

- Virtual students will be able to pick up 5 Breakfasts and 5 Lunches on Wednesdays Only from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm
- Meals can only be picked up at the school that your student is enrolled for attendance this school year.
- If you have multiple students that attend different schools in the District, you will have to prepare to pick up meals from each of those schools
- Students do not have to be present with the parent at the time of meal pickup

Please be prepared with the following information to access virtual meal pickup for your child(ren)

- Parents must know the PowerSchool student number for their student(s)
- Parents must also give the student's first and last name
- Students must be identified at their school of attendance in order to receive the meals

Parents who have paid money into their students' lunch accounts for this school year may leave it on the students account to be used at a later date as this is a temporary condition and students will return to the normal National School Lunch Program in January or sooner.
