After taking over for Bobby Waitman as the Superintendent of Tuttle Public Schools in the last year, new Superintendent Keith Sinor said he is excited about serving Tuttle through its current transition and continued growth.

“I’m excited to be here and be a part of it,” Sinor said. “Tuttle is very lucky with the Board (of Education) that they have. They care deeply about Tuttle, and they care deeply about the schools, and they care deeply about the kids. What I mean by this is there are no agendas. That is the agenda, they want the best for our kids.”

Speaking specifically of his first year in Tuttle, Sinor detailed growth in the district.

“With growth this year, we were somewhat fortunate to gain about 120 kids while we lost about 100, so the growth wasn’t as significant as it has been,” Sinor said. “Years like that give us a chance to catch up while we’re not at capacity. We are anticipating a large number of kids in the very near future with the developments that are under construction at the moment.

“We are fortunate enough to have a community that supports the district and has approved a bond that we are getting ready to start construction on. That’s going to add some additional spaces to our buildings that will help accommodate the growth.”

He believes Tuttle’s a great fit for his personality, and his family. A father of three, Sinor’s kids attend Tuttle Schools themselves.

“It’s just a great school system and it’s more than that,” Sinor said.
