Rick Huston

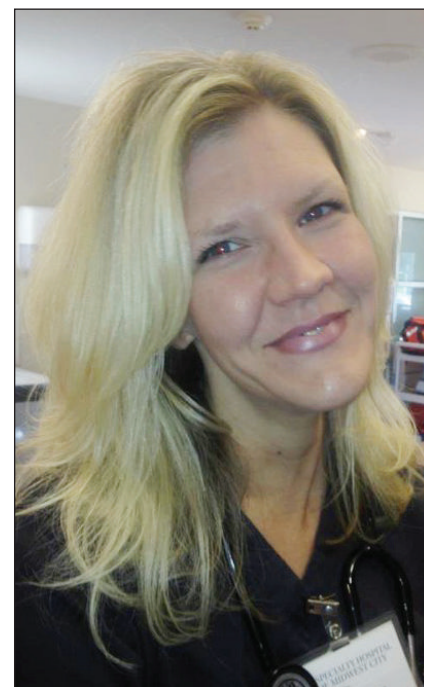
