### Malone produces 4 TDs as Leroy topples Lanett

Leroy quarterback Avery Malone threw three touchdowns passes and ran for a fourth to lead Leroy over Lanett 28-21 in a Class 2A quarterfinals showdown Friday night.

Maione connected with Caleb Moore for two long touchdown passes, and it was the second one — a 35yard strike — that provided the winning margin for the Bears in the fourth quarter.

By defeating Geneva County in the second round

of the playoffs, Leroy earned the quarterfinals matchup with Lanett at Palmer Stadium in Leroy. The game was a rematch of the 2017 state championship in Tuscaloosa where Lanett came out on top to claim the state title, but there will be no title in 2020 for Lanett as the Bears earned a wave of revenge by knocking off the defending 1A state champions.
