Mattie Starnes is the daughter of Laura and Jason Starnes. She will be playing college softball at Charlotte.


Starnes' career stats via MaxPreps: 405 BA, 85 hits, 52 RBIs, 15 doubles, 70 runs, 43 stolen bases.

Wells named to NCDOT Board

Senate Leader Phil Berger (R-Rockingham) announced on July 30 two appointments to the North Carolina Board of Transportation.

The legislature increased the oversight power of the Board and changed its composition after audits revealed wide-scale financial mismanagement at the Department of Transportation.

In a May 2020 report, Auditor Beth Wood (D) detailed

how a lack of oversight, improper budgeting procedures, and general mismanagement caused each of DOT's 14 divisions to overspend its budget, creating a combined \$750 million overage.

DOT's financial mismanagement created severe cash flow challenges. Earlier this year, the agency furloughed all of its nearly 10,000 employees.

The newly constituted Board of Transportation will have a more direct oversight role in reviewing the agency's finances and ensuring proper budgeting practices. The Board must approve the agency's spend plan and other financial matters.

House Bill 77 provides the Senate President Pro Tempore and House Speaker with three appointments each to the 20-member Board of Transportation.

Sen. Berger announced the following appointees. A third appointment will be announced at a later date.

- Andy Wells lives in Catawba County and served in the N.C. House of Representatives from 2013-14 and in the N.C. Senate from 2014-2020, representing Alexander and Catawba counties. Wells brings extensive private sector financial experience to the Board of Transportation. He manages a broad portfolio of real estate projects that includes banks, office buildings, and mixed-use developments. Wells also holds two engineering degrees from N.C. State University.

- Jerry Tillman lives in Randolph County and served in the N.C. Senate from 2003-2020. Tillman came to the Senate after a career in education. He was a teacher, coach, and principal. During his tenure in the Senate, Tillman chaired the Senate Finance Committee and the Senate Appropriations Committee on Education. *

Little hurls second fastest pitch ever clocked

Flame-throwing lefty is grandson of Taylorsville couple

Last month, a teen flame thrower with ties to Taylorsville had his dream of playing professional baseball become a reality when he was selected in the fourth round of the Major League Baseball Draft on June 10.

Luke Little, who is the son of Billie and Ecford Little of Charlotte was the fourth-round selection of the Chicago Cubs in last month's amateur draft. He was the 117th player taken in the MLB draft which was shorted to just five rounds

due to the COVID 19 pandemic.

Little has close ties to the Alexander County community as he is the grandson of Donna and Art Tomblin of Taylorsville.

A graduate of East Mecklenburg High School in Charlotte, Little was playing his sophomore season at San Jacinto, a junior college in Pasadena, Texas, when the coronavirus pandemic spelled the end of his team's campaign in March.

He returned to Charlotte in mid-March and was

working out with plans to transfer to the University of South Carolina this coming fall.

However, all that changed with a video of Little's May 8th workout surfaced on Twitter. In the video, the 6'8", 225-pound southpaw is seen throwing a fastball that reached 105 miles per hour on a radar gun. With that pitch, Little was clocked with the second-fastest recorded pitch in history.

The fastest pitch ever recorded was 105.1 mph by then-Reds reliever Aroldis Chapman against the Padres in San Diego in 2010.

Little officially signed his first professional contract with the Chicago Cub Organization on June 25. He was promptly assigned to the AZL Cubs Blue Team for more training. *
