

County approves expenditures, gives property to city

Expenditures for county entities with non-returning elected officials again dominated the meeting of the Wilbarger County Commissioners Court. The meeting was held last Friday, instead of the regular Monday meeting due to the county offices being closed for Columbus Day.

Precinct 1 commissioner John Wright said he needed to have a grader repaired, the air conditioning was not working. He also said he needs to make a hire; which Judge Greg Tyra said was already covered in the salary order for the year.

Precinct 3 commissioner

Kelly Joe Neel said he needed \$2,296 for 3 culverts. Sheriff Bill Price said

he had four spending requests. He said Unit 11 and Unit 9 each needed new four tires. He Unit 11 would cost \$763 and Unit 9 would cost \$505. Price said he had two contracts that were up for renewal. He contract with Pretorial Academy to allow the 24 jail and sheriff office employees to receive required online training and a contract at \$4,702 per year with Integrity Steel Works for maintaining the jail doors.

Judge Tyra also told Price to also get the company to replace a panel
