38. That's already three more victories than last year as they enter the final week of the regular season games and get ready for the 15th District tournament that is slated to begin on February 24 at Allen County-Scottsville.

Their overall record now stands 8-15 for the season.

Monroe County will face the #1 seed, Barren County, at Allen County-Scottsville at 6:00 pm.

It was two sophomores that helped ensure the Lady Falcons two se-

niors, Alayna Hodges and Cally Harlin, would get the "W" on their senior night. Gracie Veach and Malila Myatt led the Monroe County offensive charge with 19 points.

Myatt hit three three-pointers out of her scoring output. She connected on 3 of 5 from behind the arc and hit 6 of 6 from the charity stripe. Veach led MCHS on the boards with eight rebounds. She shot 8 of 13 from 2-point range and hit 3 of 5 free throws.

Harlin and Paisley Ford each had 4 rebounds. Ford also had seven

points. Hodges added five points for Monroe making 5 of 6 free tosses.

Kelsie Langford just missed double figures with 9 points.

Coach Clifton Hamilton was pleased with his teams' night shooting at the line. The girls hit 18 out of 25 free throws in the game for 72 %.

"We keep working on our free throws. It is one area we've seen improvement in. But like other parts of our game, we need more consistency," said Coach Hamilton.

included Curtis Petett with 8 points. Tucker Glass chipped in 7 and Kale Hagan contributed 6 points. Wade Thompson added 5 points and led the team in rebounds with 7. John Harlin had a bucket.

MCHS made 18 of 28 free throws for 64.3%.
