STAMP COLLECTING

WITH DAN MADDALINO

A few philatelic terms used throughout this series are Cover, Entire, and Cut Square. These terms apply to envelopes and postal stationary.

The stamp world does not use the term "Envelope." In its place, the term "Cover" is universally applied.

From ancient times, and around the world, messages were written on one piece of paper, rolled or folded and sent on their way. Anyone along the route could open and read them. In time it was recognized that some messages needed to be made private. Thus, was born the "cover." A second piece of paper was folded over the message and sealed to "cover" the contents.

Collecting covers is a very popular branch of philately, and it expands into personal and commercial covers, event covers, First Day covers and much more.

The term "Entire" is used to identify a full size postal stationary envelope with an embossed stamp.

During the 19th Century the British Empire embossed nearly all its Registered Mail envelopes and charged a half penny more for the envelope itself.

This has made collecting British Empire postal stationary very popular.

Collecting the embossed postage from postal stationary is also quite popular. Cutting the embossed postage from the postal stationary gives the collector a "Cut Square." This method of collecting examples of this postage is easier to find as well as much less expensive than collecting the "Entire."

This branch of philately expands into paper colors, entire sizes, and much more.
