From Jamestown to Russell Springs to Frankfort, officials are pledging a proactive, cooperative approach to combat the COVID-19 crisis.

With Governor Andy Beshear's announce-ment all "non-essential," retail business were to close across the state as of 8 p.m. Monday, local officials were not only ready, but planning ahead.

"I was actually in contact with the Governor's Office this morning," Russell County Judge Executive Gary Robertson said Monday. "I was discussing issues pertaining to Russell County."

"I really hope people follow his (Governor Beshear) mandates... so we can make it through this thing," he
