# Precautions at RCDC

Jailer Bobby Dunbar at the Russell County Detention Center (RCDC) state that all steps are being taken by he and his staff to prevent COVID-19 entering the jail.

"Since the outbreak first initially began being discussed, special precautions were put into place," Dunbar said. "At this time, everything and everyone unless you are essential has been stopped from coming into the RCDC."

When employees, including Dunbar himself, enter the facility, they are immediately taken to a closed-off room to have their temperatures taken and are asked a list of
