## 2020 Census – Don't Forget the Children

According to the US Census Bureau, children were one of the most under-counted groups in the 2010 Census, so the Census Bureau is working hard to make sure we get the word out about counting young children.

Census results inform decisions on funding for the next 10 years for programs and services, including those that affect children such as schools, libraries, and nutrition assistance.

Many programs that receive funding based on census data directly impact the wellbeing of children. This includes programs like Head Start, K-12 schools, nutrition assistance, and many others. Knowing how many children live in an area can greatly influence the placement of new schools, libraries, hospitals, and more — which can all have an impact on most often, count them where they were staying on April 1.

•If a child's family (or guardian) was or is temporarily staying somewhere and plans to return to their former address, count the child at their usual residence.

•If a child's family (or guardian) has moved permanently after April 1, count children at the address where they lived on April 1.


Yet young children are among groups historically undercounted in decennial censuses. In the 2010 Census, there was a net undercount of nearly 1 million (or 4.6% of) children under age five, making them one of the largest population groups undercounted in the United States.

It is vital that all young children, including newborns born on or before April 1, 2020, are included when their parents or guardians respond to the census. children for their entire lifetime.

Do you have young children in your home? Be sure to count them in the right place. Here are some guidelines to help you respond to the 2020 Census:

•Count children in the home where they live and sleep most of the time, even if their parents do not live there.

•If children divide their time between more than one household, count them where they stay most often. If they evenly divide their time or you don't know where they stay
