Taking one of two trucks they brought for the job, Collins and Bryant traveled over humps, across bumps, through two creeks, and forged through fields looking for the

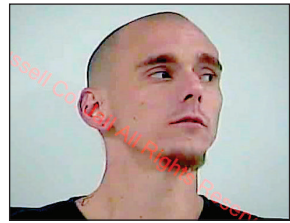
