

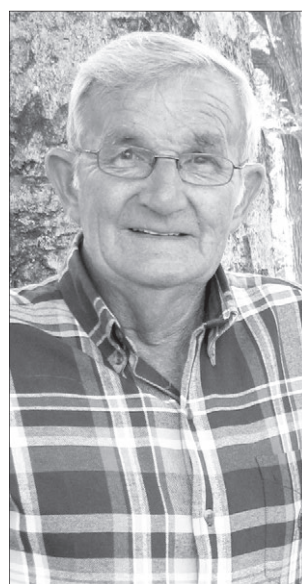
**Steve "Butch" Jewell, 70**
