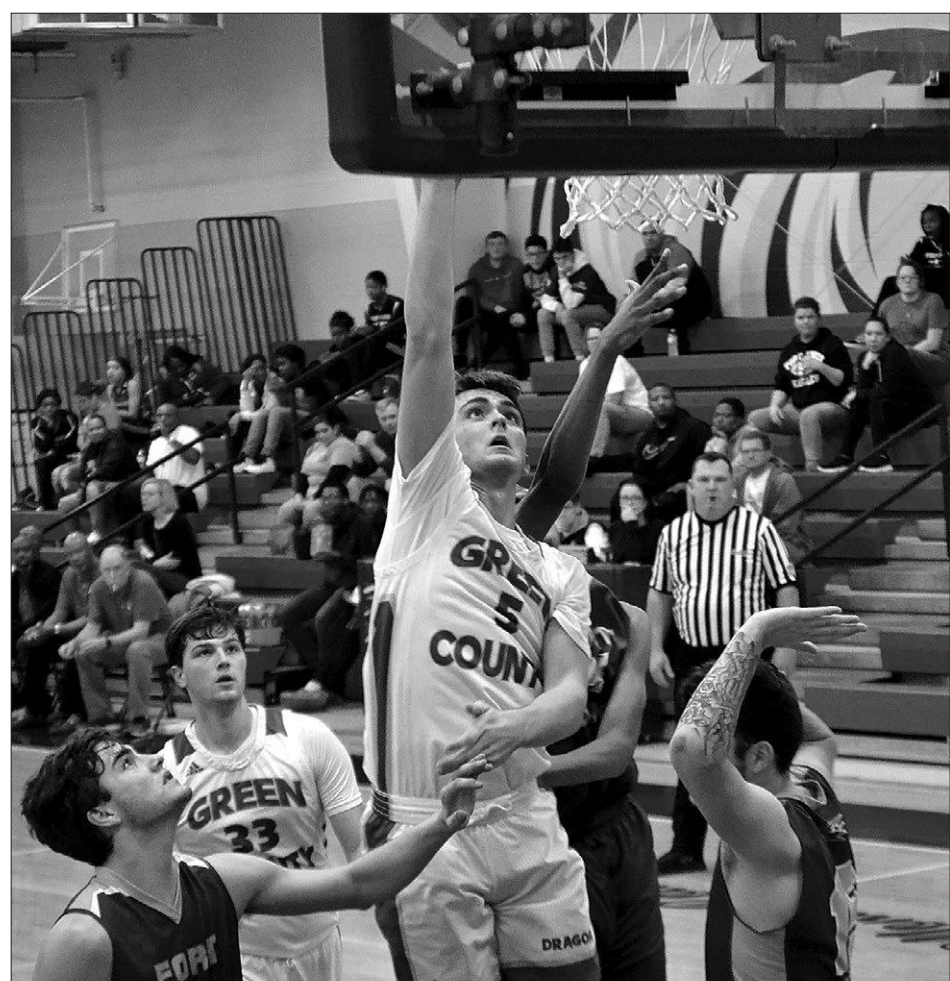
Keaton Perkins gave Green County some valuable minutes coming off the bench against Campbellsville.
