**Little Barren** - Getting wood and shoveling snow seems to be the order of the day around here.

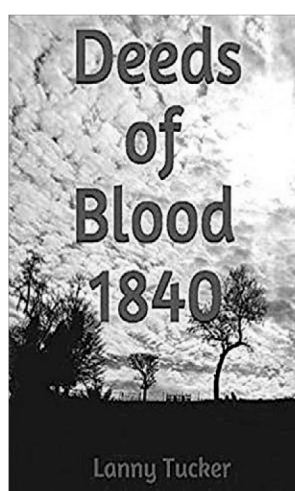

Located in the heart of Central Kentucky, Taylor Regional Hospital is dedicated to providing outstanding medical care by serving the people of Campbellsville and the regional service
