City approves first reading of tax rate

Greensburg City Council, in a special called meeting September 8 via Zoom and Facebook Live, approved by a 4-2 vote the first reading of the real and personal property tax

rate for 2020.

The rate will be 24.3 cents per \$100 of assessed value with Council members Jerry Cowherd, Connie Judd, C.W. Van Arsdale, and Marty Young voting in favor and Robbie Eastham and Tony Morgan voting against.

This will bring in projected revenue of \$187,681.

"This rate is comparable to last year's, which allows the City to continue to provide essential services for Greensburg residents," said Greensburg Mayor John Shuffett.
