Listen Well



"My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires."
 —James 1:19-20 NIV

One of the greatest gifts that we can give to others is the gift of listening. Most of us think we know how to listen, but consider how often we find ourselves growing bored while listening or chomping at the bit to get a word in, or misunderstanding others. The psychologist Carl Rogers diagnosed the problem with our listening skills as being primarily a problem of us wanting to judge or evaluate the other person and suggested the following exercise. During a dispute, each person can state his own case only after restating the other person's position accurately and to the satisfaction of the other person. This will ensure that you have heard the other person's position and may require the other person to reiterate their position more clearly, and in any case, it allows both parties to a dispute to go away with a better understanding of both sides of the issue. Another way to improve our listening skills is to resist the urge to give advice. This can be nearly impossible to do when we think we know exactly what the other person should do, but it is often better to let the other person come to his or her own conclusions, and by letting them talk, you are letting them think through their problem or issue. To listen well, you usually don't need to say a word.
