### **McConnell: Historic Peace Agreements** between Israel and Arab countries

U.S. Senate Majority Leader Mitch Mc-Connell (R-KY) delivered the following remarks Tuesday on the Senate floor regarding the Middle East:

"When I address the situation in the Middle East, it's often to discuss instability, terror, or other threats to the United States and its partners like Israel.

"Those threats still exist. But I'm very glad to be speaking today because peace is breaking out. And it's breaking out more quickly than we can even stage the official ceremonies to memorialize the diplomatic achievements.

"A few weeks ago, withmajorhelpfromthe United States and the Trump administration, Israel and the United Arab Emirates reached the first Arab-Israeli peace deal in 26 years.

"The Abraham Accord is named for the shared religious roots that Christians, Jews, and Muslims hold in common. It will make the UAE just the third Arab nation, and the very first in the Gulf, to normalize relations with Israel. "In the words of **Capitol Focus**
