

# XC Cow Days 5K held despite pandemic and rain



Shawna Shuffett was the first overall female to cross the finish line, 11th overall. Shuffett beat her goal time of 26 minutes with a clocked finish of 24:42.56.



Freshman Jayden Marr ran the Cow Days CoronaDay 5K in 19:14.97. Green County Cross Country runner Marr was second overall finisher behind Joseph Hartlage. Hartlage was first with a finish time of 16:54.38.



Adam Cecil finished third overall with his time of 19:53:76, a 6:24 mile; his son finished 12th with a 25:35:10 in his first 5K.



Competitive walker Ambrose Wilson smiled and rung his cow bell, presented by Greensburg Mayor John Michael Shuffett, after he finished the 5K race in 40:37.51. The 5K was held October 10 in downtown Greensburg and 34 individuals participated with a number of spectators. The event is an annual Cross County team fundraiser.
