A steady line of cars looped through American Legion Park pausing momentarily for a volunteer to load a food box. 1,248 boxes were loaded with an assortment of dairy products, meat, and produce arrived in a semi-truck early Monday morning. Green County was the 27th county to have a food box drive-in, hosted by the Kentucky Dairy **Development Council, Lexington. This program is funded by the Coronavi**rus Food Assistance Program.
