Republican Tate Reeves sworn in as new Mississippi governor

Republican Tate Reeves was inaugurated Tuesday, January 14, as the new governor of Mississippi, pledging to provide economic opportunities for all people in the state and to defend a "loving culture that underpins our quality of life."

Reeves, 45, is the 65th governor of Mississippi. He succeeds Republican Phil Bryant, who served two terms.

Reeves served two terms as lieutenant governor and two terms before that as the elected state treasurer. He took the oath as governor before family, friends, lawmakers and other officials in the House chamber of the state Capitol.

"A culture of love and kinship has knitted Mississippi families together, and tied them to each other, for ages," Reeves said in the text of his inaugural speech. "It is what 2020 season.

makes us special in a fastpaced and transient world. I will defend that culture against the erosion that frays societies."
