The show kicked off with the Market Swine Show with 4-H'ers showing swine in Commercial Gilt, Market Barrow and Market Hog categories subdivided into weight divisions, as well as Showmanship in age divisions.

In the Commercial Gilt division, Preston Carnathan placed 2nd, Lilly Word, 5th; John Franklin Johnson, 6th, and Emma Word, 8th, with their Crossbred gilts. Heidi Hudson placed 7th with her "Down-Ear" gilt. In the Barrow show, Lightweight division, Bennett Word placed 4th, John Hudson Word, 6th, and Braxton Horn 10th. In Medium weight barrows, Sara Word placed 8th, John Franklin Johnson, 9th, Bennett Word, 10th, and Hanna Hood, 12th. Cameron Martin placed 9th with her heavyweight barrow.
