The body of a Holmes County man was recovered from Bee Lake near Thornton on Monday, March 16.

Chester Davis Henry, 69, who reportedly lived on Highway 17 north, was reported missing by family on Wednesday, March 11.

According to Holmes County Deputy Coroner Ruby Redmond, Henry was discovered by state game wardens in the lake around 3:15/3:20 p.m. Redmond said Henry had no obvious about fifty yards where his or apparent injuries.
