The Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) is advising people to not flush disinfecting wipes, paper towels, or similar products in toilets but to dispose of them in household garbage. These items can cause damage to wastewater treatment and collection systems creating clogs, backups, pump failures, and sewer overflows creating additional public

"An increasing number of people are currently at home and consuming more wipes and paper towels than normal. Please dispose of these items properly with your other household garbage," said Chris Wells, MDEQ Interim Executive Director.
