The Department's Agriculture and Livestock Theft Bureau will be contacting local law enforcement officers to communicate that agriculture and related industries are essential businesses and should be permitted to operate and travel.

This information is also being provided to associations and leaders in the agriculture and commerce community to provide to their members and constituents, along with their own guidance and cre-
