Former NFL quarterback Brett Favre is repaying \$1.1 million in welfare money that he received for multiple speeches where he did not show up, the Mississippi state auditor said Wednesday, May 6.



The audit released Monday said the center paid Favre Enterprises \$500,000 in December 2017 and \$600,000 in June 2018, and he was supposed to make speeches for at least three events.

Favre has not returned to him by The Associated Press since Monday. His manager, Bus Cook, told AP on Wednesday: "We've got nothing to say."

In an audit, White said his employees identified \$94 million in questionable spending by the agency, including payments for sports activities with no clear connection to helping needy people in one of the poorest states of the U.S.

The audit was released months after a former Human Services director and five other people were indicted on state charges of embezzling about \$4 million. They have pleaded not guilty and are awaiting trial in what White has called one of Mississippi's largest public corruption cases in decades.

"If there was a way to misspend money, it seems DHS leadership or their grantees thought of it and tried it," White said.

John Davis was director of the Department of Human Services from January 2016 until July 2019, appointed by then-Gov. Phil Bryant — a Republican who also appointed White to office when a previous auditor stepped down.

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
