On Friday, May 15, at approximately 11:30 a.m., a deputy U.S. Marshal was shot and wounded in Oxford, Mississippi, while attempting to execute an arrest warrant.

The deputy was part of a team looking for Hunter Carlstrom, a fugitive wanted for capital murder in Arkansas.

Preliminary information indicated Carlstrom produced a handgun and fired upon the team when they approached his vehicle and commanded him to exit. In response, officers returned fire striking Carlstrom.

No other law enforcement personnel were injured. The shooting investigation is being led by the Mississippi Bureau of Investigation. As a matter of policy, the U.S. Marshals Service will not release the names of deputy marshals involved in shooting incidents, until the conclusion of all investigations surrounding the incident."
